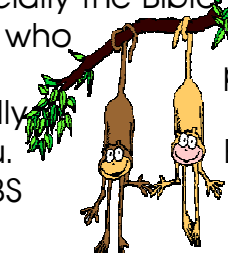

WWJD

When I mention these letters many people think they know what they stand for. But did you know that they could refer to a Radio Station? According to Wikipedia, WWJD (91.7FM, "Eagle 91.7") is a radio station in Kentucky.

But, in the minds of most, the letters do not remind them of a **Radio Station**, but of the **Man who is salvation**. Wikipedia also says:

The phrase "What would Jesus do?" (often abbreviated to WWJD) became popular in the United States in the 1890s and again in the 1990s as a personal motto for thousands of Christians who used the phrase as a reminder of their belief that Jesus is the example to be followed in daily life, and to act in a manner of which Jesus would approve.

I have seen **WWJD** on bracelets, wristbands, necklaces, belts, shirts, key chains, hats, and other things. They are very famous letters in the Christian religion. The letters do remind us of a good question to ask: **What Would Jesus Do?** But in this devotional we will use them to refer to three other things.

WWJD - What Would Jesus DESIRE?

What would Jesus **desire** for you in 2010? The Bible answers that question for us. He "**desires** all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (I Tim. 2:3-4). Therefore, He **desires** that you be "born again" of "water and the Spirit" (Jn. 3:3-5). Just before He ascended back to heaven He said to His followers, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit" (Matt. 28:19). He also **desires** that you "be faithful" (Rev. 2:10) and that you go to heaven when you die. In His prayer in John 17:24 He prayed, "Father, I **desire** that they also whom You gave Me may be with Me where I am."

WWJD - What Would Jesus DELIVER?

When we do what He desires, what would He **deliver**? The Bible has the answer. He "**delivers** us from the wrath to come" (I Thess. 1:10). Therefore, He **delivers** salvation (II Tim. 2:10). He **delivers** strength "in the inner man" (Eph. 3:16). He **delivers** security. Paul said, "the Lord will **deliver** me from every evil work and preserve me for His heavenly kingdom" (II Tim. 4:18). He **delivers** hope, healing, and help in time of need.

WWJD - What Would Jesus DESERVE?

When we do what He desires and receive what He delivers, what would He **deserve**? He would **deserve** our worship and praise. "Worthy is the Lamb, who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and praise!" (Rev. 5:12). When we consider the "mercies of God" revealed in the sacrifice of Jesus for us, then we should "present our bodies a living sacrifice" in service to God (Rom. 12:1). He would **deserve** our commitment to His word. How could we sum up what He would **deserve** from us? Try these letters, **WWJD - Walk With Jesus Daily**.
